10. Exhibits will be released from 8:00 am – 10:00 am the last Sunday of fair week. No exhibits will be released prior to Sunday's release time. Exhibitors will forfeit any prize money awarded on exhibits removed early. Any item left after 10 am Sunday may be discarded. Every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of exhibits, but in no case will the management be responsible for loss or injury to the same, not any loss of property or exhibits not called for on Sunday.

PURITY OF VARIETY, FORM, PLUMPNESS, COLOR, ADAPTATION, FREEDOM FROM DISEASE, WEED SEED AND OTHER FOREIGN MATTER and PROPERLY NAMED AND LABELED.

1. All seeds and grasses must be grown by the exhibitor.
2. Sheaves to be three inches in diameter below heads.
3. Exhibitors are allowed to make only one entry per class.
4. No pre-registration required.
5. Bring extra twine for bales of hay and straw so the judge can look into the bales.
